Nola Kileleman Hix Appointed Regional Director for the U.S. Territories & Democrats Abroad by the Association of State Democratic Committees

In a bold and historic move, the Association of State Democratic Committees (ASDC) hired Nola Kileleman Hix to serve as the first regional director for the U.S. Territories and Democrats Abroad. Though the territories will continue meeting with their respective regions—the Western and Eastern Caucuses of the ASDC-DNC—the creation of this position within the ASDC signals the importance of the territories to the ASDC and the Democratic National Committee (DNC) and bolsters the partnership between the democratic parties in the territories and their counterparts in the fifty states. As the territories begin to utilize tools and programs that have heretofore been unavailable to them, they will rely on their very own regional director for guidance, collaboration, and training.

Ms. Hix has been a member of the DNC since 2016. She served as the Executive Director of the Democratic Party of the Northern Mariana Islands (DPNMI) for three years, and in that role, she was responsible for party operations, fundraising, and federal relations with the ASDC and the DNC. Ms. Hix chaired the NMI Democratic Party from 2018–2022, the first woman to do so in the party's history. She worked with party officials and supporters to rebuild the party and was instrumental in the election of nine democrats across the CNMI House and Senate in 2020, creating a supermajority composed of democrats and independents in both chambers. In 2024, Ms. Hix worked to ensure the NMI Democratic Party registered with and received official recognition by the Federal Election Commission as an official state political party committee. Her leadership resulted in the first democratic party in any territory to achieve FEC recognition. Hix's private sector experience and volunteer work across various community organizations have earned her manifold accolades and the respect of friends and colleagues across the islands.

That the ASDC saw fit to create a new regional caucus and to hire a person from that region speaks to the importance of the territories to the ASDC and the DNC. This is a full circle moment for Ms. Hix as she founded the DNC's U.S. Territories Alliance in 2019 when she was Chair of the DPNMI. NMI Democrats wish Ms. Hix the very best in her new role and look forward to working with her in the months and years ahead as the party rebuilds, recruits candidates, coordinates with our federal partners, and readies itself for the election.
